In 2018, Ku`ulei joined Na Ali`i in Arlington, VA, which is part of Nakupuna Foundation Family of Companies, a non-profit organization headquartered in Honolulu, HI.

An active Hawaiian cultural community leader, Ku`ulei co-founded/co-organized three 501(c)(3) non-profit Native Hawaiian cultural schools/organizations in the Washington, D.C. area. She is currently Director of Community Engagement with E Ala E Hawaiian Cultural Center in the Northern Virginia area. She is a former president of the Hawai`i State Society of Washington, D.C., former 1st Vice President of Ke Ali`i Maka`āinana Hawaiian Civic Club of Washington, D.C., and a member of the Kamehameha Schools East Coast Alumni Association. Ku`ulei is an avid pool player and enjoys spending time with her two furry Siamese buddies, Hōkū and Kekoa.
