Of Native Hawaiian ancestry, Ku`ulei was born and raised on O`ahu and graduated from the Kamehameha School for Girls in Honolulu. She received her BA degree in Education from Albion College, MI. She spent most of her career as President of Travelcorp, a travel agency that designed and executed deluxe group incentive travel programs to international destinations.

In 2011, Ku`ulei joined Pacific Center for Economic Development as its Director of Native Hawaiian Cultural Resources in the D.C. area. Five years later, she took a position at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs in Washington, D.C. In 2018, Ku`ulei joined Na Ali`i in Arlington, VA, which is part of Nakupuna Companies headquartered in Honolulu, HI. As of February 2024, Ku`ulei is now Executive Director and Chief Cultural Officer of Lauola Pono, a Native Hawaiian organization in Northern Virginia.

An active Hawaiian cultural community leader, Ku`ulei co-founded three 501(c)(3) non-profit Native Hawaiian cultural organizations in the DMV area (Washington, D.C., Maryland, and Virginia). She is currently CEO of E Ala E Hawaiian Cultural Center, a non-profit organization headquartered in Alexandria, VA. She also served two terms as President of the Hawai`i State Society of Washington, D.C., several terms as 1st Vice President of Ke Ali`i Maka`āinana Hawaiian Civic Club of Washington, D.C. and is a member of the Kamehameha Schools East Coast Alumni Association. Ku`ulei enjoys giving back to her community and spending time with her two (spoiled!) Siamese buddies, Hōkū and Kekoa!
